Do you believe in fully and equitably funding public education, from preschool to postsecondary institutions, with several billion dollars in new education investments?

Kristi Pursell

"Our children are the future of our community, and the quality of a child's education shouldn't depend on where they live! The public school I went to was excellent, and I want the same for my kids and yours. We must do what we can to provide young people with the tools they need to become our future workforce as they become adults. That means giving our students, educators, and schools the resources they need."

How would you support Minnesota's higher education system?

Kristi Pursell

"I will continue to work towards increased access to free postsecondary education, and continue to work to refinance and forgive student loans, and ensuring paying off student loans can count as match for pensions for public employees."

Blamed Biden's student debt forgiveness programs for the public's falling trust in college, "Trust in colleges falls to 36% ... Biden administration reinforces this stat with his continuous push to make us pay for other's student debt which the student contractually agreed to pay for what they rec'd in their college's program."

How will you support unions and address issues in collectively bargained contracts?

I remember seeing my folks on picket lines during strikes. I knew that collectively bargaining for rights and pay was key to being able to afford our lives and stay in my home."

How will you support efforts to lower inequitable penalties in the Teachers Retirement Association to expand retirement options?

"I was the author of a bill that will most help newer teachers count their student loan payments as their contribution for the pension match so that even if these public servants have student debt, they can continue to save for retirement instead of having to choose one or the other."
